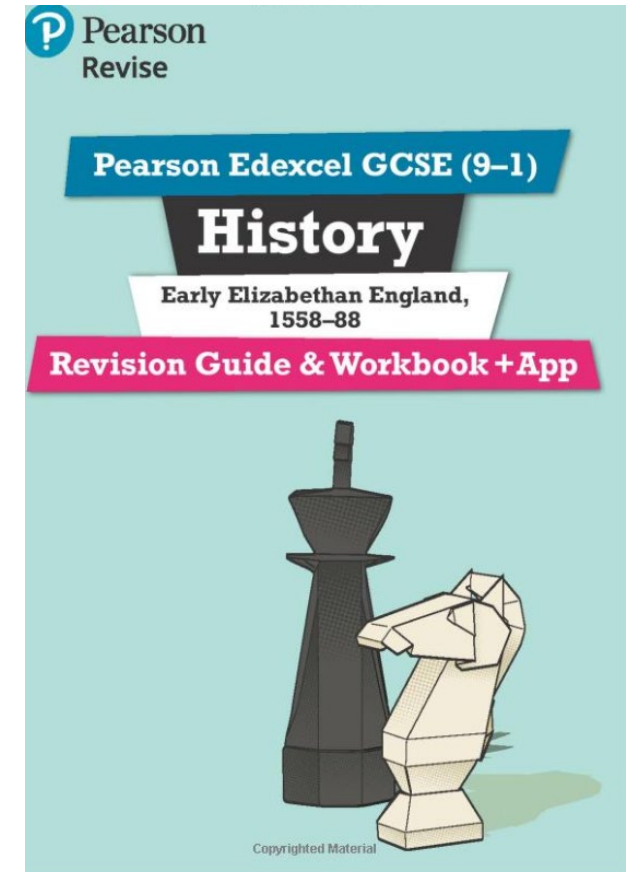
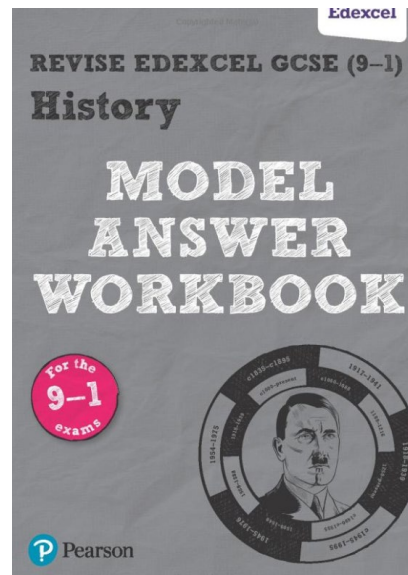

Exam technique- Evidence

Specific evidence is absolutely VITAL in achieving the top grade: for example, stating '*Vesalius was significant because he impacted other individuals*' is correct but **vague**.

'Vesalius was significant because his work, the Fabric of the Human Body, showed detailed drawings of the anatomy, going against the predominant view of Galen's four humours, which influenced individuals such as Harvey because...' Is correct and **specific**.

Exam technique- Explanation

What is important but *why* and *what* is more important.

Big answer questions (12 and 16) you must use development consistently.

Force you to explain your point with specific evidence.
